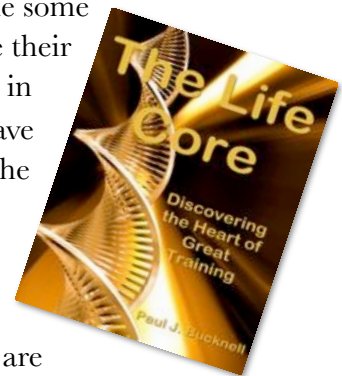

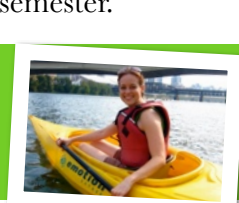

Benjamin almost 18, hasn't done as much baking but has done well transitioning to the virtual school. As a senior he was able to take an English



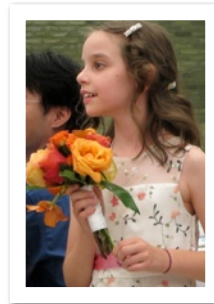
composition class at the community college (and get an A). Next semester he takes two courses, more closely aligned with his interest in designing computer games. He loves using his new 5th generation iPod Touch.



Rebekah 11, loves talking to others. She has recently begun mastering some basic cooking skills including baking cookies along with her sister, Kathryn.

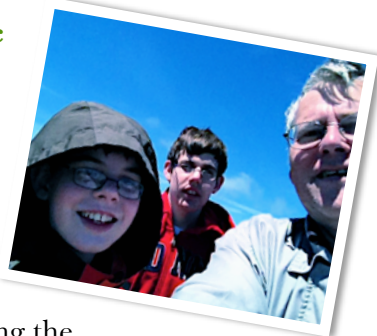
We all look forward to Elizabeth's upcoming wedding to Brooks White.
