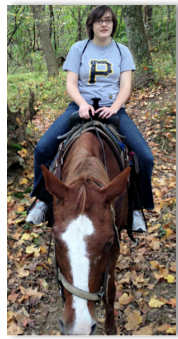
Daniel loves his job caring for and walking dogs for his clients. He will adjust this job to part-time when he starts some college courses next month.



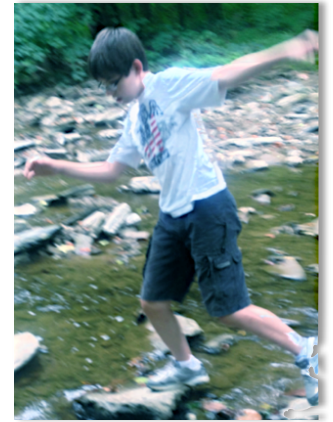
