## Paul & BFF Ministry

Each year finds us relying on the LORD more and more to manage. Perhaps it's our age, or perhaps, it is our growing family, with three kids in college, traveling, and a very intensive ministry.

One of Paul's biggest challenges this year was team teaching the Book of Revelation for our church Sunday Training class. He cannot ever remember needing to pour so much time and concentration into preparation. Fortunately, they started early, but still there was intense study needed for each weekly lesson. But the

timing is of the Lord, seeing the increase of calamity going on around us. Has Satan been released (Rev 20:3)? Is the earth transitioning into its last days before it will be burnt up (2 Pe 3:10)? Perhaps this is the time Daniel wrote of, "But as for you, Daniel, conceal these words and seal up the book until the end of time; many will go back and forth, and knowledge will increase" (Dan 12:4; Rev 22:10).

This year is the first time that Linda was able to go with Paul on an overseas ministry trip. The Family Seminar in Taiwan afforded them a great opportunity to minister to families in Taiwan as well as visit their old stomping grounds in Taichung. What was once

so familiar in the 1980s, has drastically changed. Paul also spoke at the Mother's Day services at the church that began in their living room outside of

Kaohsiung. An updated transportation system and orderly traffic made travel a pleasure.

During the Myanmar leg of the trip we taught a marriage seminar in greater Yangon. The church structure where the seminar was held collapsed soon after due to heavy rains. They still have no church building.



Paul's resources have continued to grow. He published a greatly expanded *The Bible Teaching Commentary on* 

Romans and its companion study question book. Several other books are now in paperback. By God's grace he added 3 foreign translations: Chinese (Premarital Counseling), Hindi (The Life Core) and Burmese (Building a Great Marriage).

Someone commented on the marriage book, "You have a cheerful, hopeful tone in spite of very honest treatment of

difficult marriage situations; thankfully it is contagious." "Your materials are quite thorough without being too scholarly." This well summarizes Paul's goal of bringing God's truth into the lives of God's people.



the Interior Design program at Judson University. She has been challenged by the art and design classes while most interestingly enjoyed her wood-working class. The parquetry to the right, she designed




and made. She has taken some big steps, learning to travel on planes and trains by herself. She likes the beautiful campus and the people she has met.
